LEGAL ADVOCACY

We supported **2,454** individuals through the complex and challenging legal system.



THERAPY

We provided trauma-specific, evidence-based therapy to **462** children, teens, and adults to help them recover from trauma.



PARENT EDUCATION

We supported parents of **360** children in learning how to better facilitate their child's healing.



24-HOUR RESOURCE LINE

We answered **3,662** calls and provided information, crisis support, and referrals.



PREVENTION EDUCATION & OUTREACH

We reached **53,941** individuals with sexual violence prevention education, training, and outreach both in person and online.

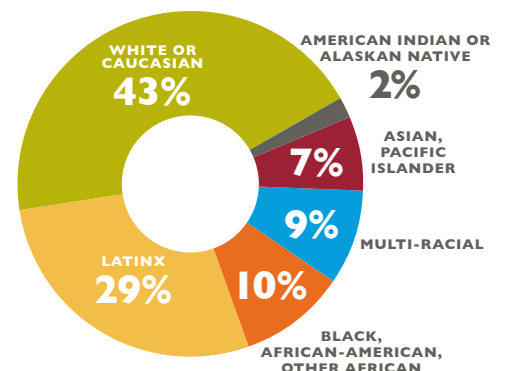
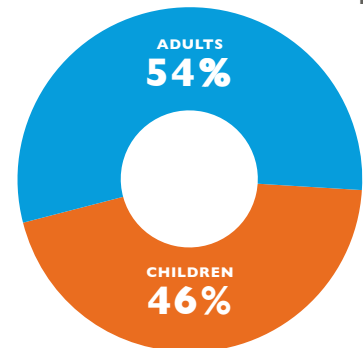
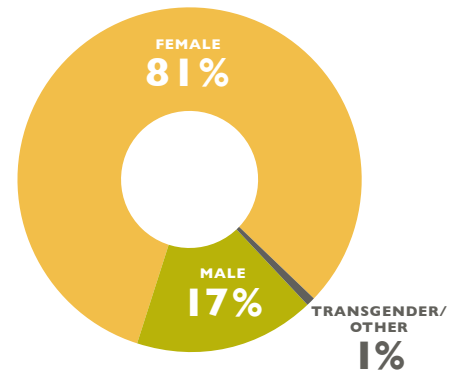


DANDO VOZ (GIVING VOICE)

CLIENTS SERVED IN 2019

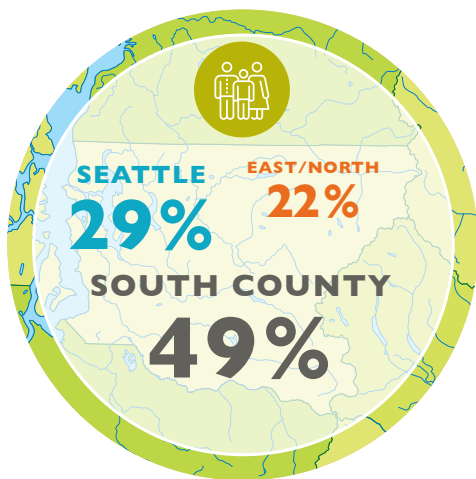
FACT: Sexual violence impacts people of all genders, ages, races, and ethnicities.



In 2019, KCSARC provided 4,905 individuals and their families with direct services.

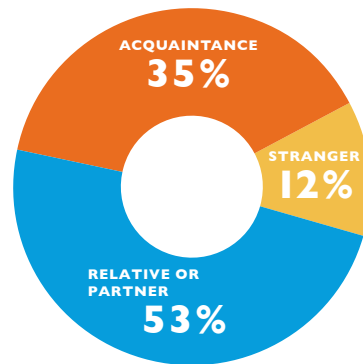
RESIDENCE OF 2019 KCSARC CLIENTS

FACT: We serve survivors across King County, with offices in Renton, Federal Way, and Redmond. We offer services across the county to residents of all ages.

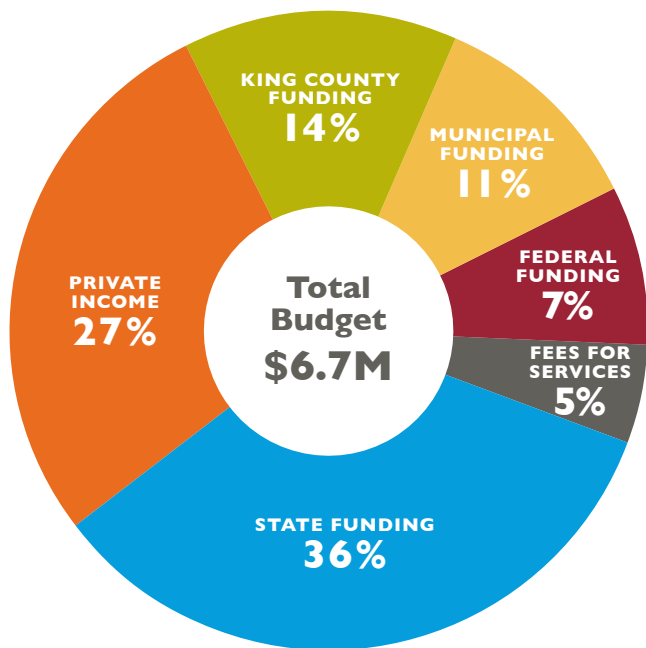


RELATIONSHIP OF OFFENDERS TO VICTIMS IN 2019 KCSARC CASES

FACT: Most survivors know the person who assaulted them prior to the assault. Contrary to common myths about rape, relatively few survivors of sexual assault are victimized by strangers. This is reflected in the data we collect about our clients.

FACT: Diverse funding sources helped KCSARC serve almost **5,000** clients in 2019. The majority of our funding came from local, county, state, and federal sources. Private contributions continue to be an important and growing resource for KCSARC.
