Navigating Justice



A report to the community on sexual assault victim case outcomes in King County Superior Court system

March 2024



Background

In 2021, the King County Sexual Assault Resource Center issued its "Long Wait" report. That point-in-time snapshot showed 408 sexual assault victims had open cases, and had waited almost 19 months for resolution since the time the defendant in their case was arraigned. The average victim was 16; the average defendant was 39 when data was pulled.

"The Long Wait" also showed the seriousness of the harm victims had experienced.

Three-fourths of the charges pending were crimes against children. Of those, 38% were Class A felonies.



About the data in our report


KCSARC advocates assist most, but not all, sexual assault survivors in King County Superior Court. This report reflects only data about victims assisted by KCSARC.

"The Long Wait" and "Navigating Justice" pertain to King County Superior Court, which handles criminal cases involving adult defendants only.

The data includes 408 victims and 319 defendants. Victims outnumber defendants because many defendants have multiple victims.

Outcomes: 408 victims



Unresolved

Pending Trial 12 of 13 victim cases in trial are for child sex offenses.

Failure to Appear (FTA): 12 of 13 victims where defendant has failed to appear are charged with Class A child sex offenses.



Victims have been waiting almost 4 years since arraignment.

Dismissals: 14%



Negotiated cases: Implications for victims & community

In 60% of victim cases, defendants pleaded to lesser charges.
