PREVENTION, EDUCATION & OUTREACH

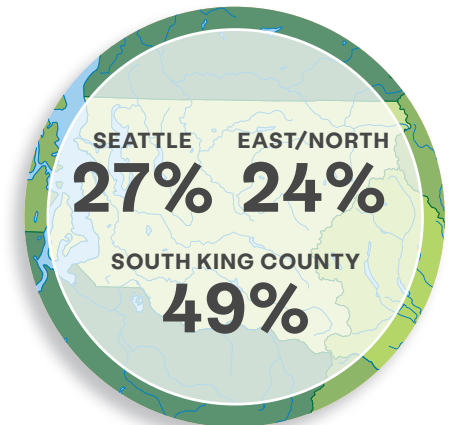


We empowered **73,505** community members with information and resources both online and in-person to push back on sexual violence.



Our prevention educators trained and advised **5,653** adults and young people in schools, community groups and other settings to better identify, prevent and respond to sexual abuse.

Advocates responded to **2,416** calls for crisis support, information and referrals.



THERAPY

373 children, teens and adults participated in trauma-specific, evidence-based therapy that is proven effective in treating trauma.

2,100 survivors were supported through the complex and challenging legal system.



FAMILY SERVICES

Parents and caregivers of **1,241** young survivors had the support they needed to help their child heal.

2,100 survivors and their families were supported and connected to services.

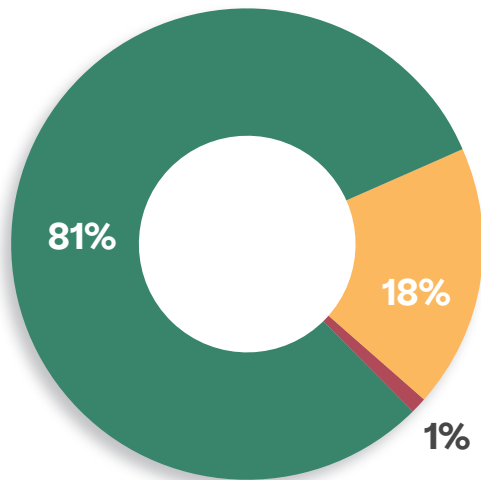


DANDO VOZ (GIVING VOICE)

583 Spanish-speaking clients accessed culturally relevant therapy, general and legal advocacy, family services and referrals.

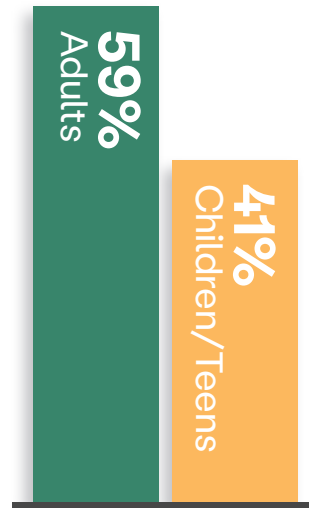

GENDER

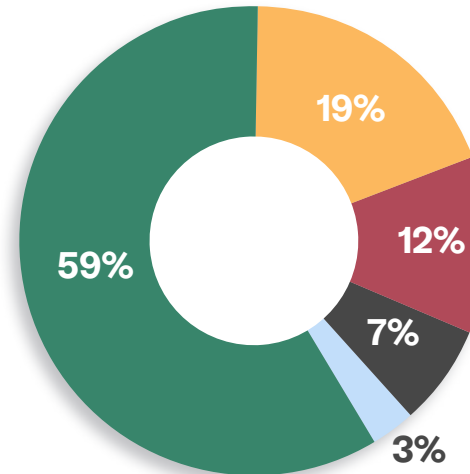


- FEMALE

AGE

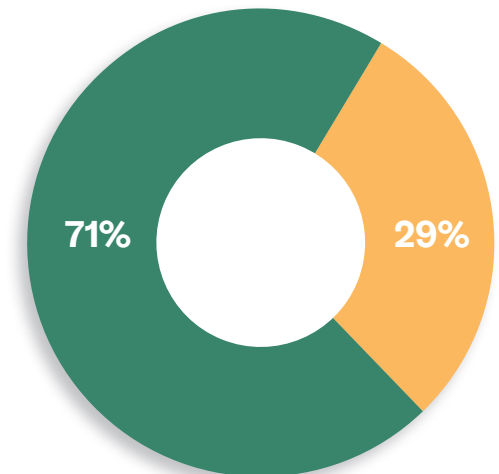


RACE
